

Plurals

Language focus

Many nouns are countable nouns. We can count them. Countable nouns have two forms: singular and plural.

- We use a singular noun to talk about one person, animal, thing or place.

e.g. I have a cat.

We use a plural noun to talk about more than one person, animal, thing or place.

e.g. I have two cats.

	Singular noun	Plural noun
1. Add '-s' to most nouns.	cap	caps
2. Add '-es' to nouns ending in '-s', '-x', '-z', '-ch', and '-sh'	bus	buses
3. Add '-s' to nouns ending in vowel and '-y'.	key	keys
4. Change '-y' into '-ies' for nouns ending in consonant and '-y'.	baby	babies
5. Change '-f' or '-fe' to '-ves' for some* nouns ending in '-f' or '-fe'.	leaf	leaves
6. Add '-es' to some* nouns ending in '-o'.	tomato	tomatoes
7. There are no spelling rules for irregular nouns.	child feet	children foot

*There are some exceptions to the nouns ending in '-f', '-fe' and '-o'.




