

2 rules to turn a Verb into an Adjective

1: Present Participles end with "ing"

- used to describe someone or something that is causing a feeling or doing an action.

2: Past Participles end with "ed" or "en"

- used to describe someone's feelings or to show something has happened to them.

Example: The teacher is amusing the student.

The amusing teacher (amusing describes the teacher)

The amused student (amused describes the object student)
